SUBJECT: TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION THAT THE BOARD OF NYE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS IMPLEMENT ALL NECESSARY LEGAL PROCEDURES AT ONCE TO ESTABLISH AT-LARGE VOTING FOR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump takes notice that the population figures for cities and towns in Nye County, Nevada have changed dramatically in recent years and more especially since the Nye County Commissioners enacted election of commissioners by voting districts, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump takes notice that the majority of the population of Nye County resides in the Pahrump Valley area, and

WHEREAS, under the current voting district system Pahrump is entitled to elect only two county commissioners, and

WHEREAS, the two elected county commissioners from the Pahrump districts are unable to statistically represent the population of the Pahrump Valley resulting in inadequate and unfair representation for the citizens of the Pahrump Valley, and

WHEREAS, the population of the Pahrump Valley will continue to grow over the foreseeable future resulting in additional needs for services in the Pahrump area, and

WHEREAS, these services can only be implemented, operated and supervised by adequate representation on the Nye County Board of Commissioners, and

WHEREAS, N.R.S. 244.050 provides for the election of county commissioners at-large.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town Board of the unincorporated Town of Pahrump does resolve as follows:

That the Board of Nye County Commissioners implement all necessary legal procedures at once to establish at-large voting for county commissioners in Nye County, Nevada.

PAHRUMP TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 96 R-02

SUBJECT: TOWN BOARD RESOLUTION THAT THE TOWN BOARD INDEMNIFY EMPLOYEES WHO ARE SUED PERSONALLY UNDER SCOPE OF THEIR EMPLOYMENT.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump feels a necessary commitment and responsibility to the protection of the employees of the Town of Pahrump, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump has become aware of lawsuits which target Town employees personally, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump recognizes that these lawsuits, even if frivolous in nature, must be defended by the employees for their own protection, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump recognizes that the defense of these actions could be costly, time-consuming and of great concern and stressful to those said employees, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump wishes to ensure its employees that it will assist them in any way possible in the defense of these actions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town Board of the unincorporated Town of Pahrump does resolve as follows:

1. That the Town Board of Town of Pahrump, by and through its legal counsel, shall review and assess all lawsuits which target Town employees personally;
2. Where the actions complained of occurred in the course and scope of employment by the employee and/or integrally connect with the duties and responsibilities of the employee as designated by the Town Board, then the Town Board of the Town of Pahrump shall assume the defense of said actions and shall indemnify said employee for all reasonable costs associated with said defense, unless said employee shall desire to undertake their own defense of the action;
3. Wherever possible the Town Board shall utilize the appropriate insurance coverage to further insure the adequate defense of its employees;

4. That the nature and extent of the indemnification and protection of the employee by the appropriate legal defense shall be determined solely in the discretion of the Pahrump Town Board unless otherwise assumed by said employee;
5. That this Resolution shall apply to the currently existing lawsuit against the Pahrump Town Manager, Roger Baltz.




WHEREAS, these Amateur Radio operators donate these services free of charge to the Town, in the interest of the citizens of the Town as well as the world; and


WHEREAS, this year's Amateur Radio Field Day will take place on June 22-23, 1996;



- THEREFORE:** As the Pahrump Town Board, we do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 through 23 as






